You need the signature of a faculty member for these courses:

CS 610 for Masters students; not a requirement.

CS 611 for PhD students who have completed at least 36 hours; may be repeated up to 18 hours.

CS 612 for Masters students; not a requirement; may be repeated up to 9 hours.

CS 748 for Masters students working half-time or full-time on thesis having completed all other coursework. May be repeated up to 6 semesters. Also requires the signature of the DGS.

CS 749 for PhD students after completing two full-time semesters of CS 769; 0 credits.

CS 767 for PhD students planning to take a qualifying exam during the semester; 2 credits.

CS 768 for Masters students needing residence credit; may be repeated up to 12 hours.

CS 769 for PhD students needing residence credit; usually taken for two semesters.
