 1. This selection is not intended to discourage calling other tunes that are not listed, and it is not a scientifically objective record of AASHS singings, which date back 25+ years. The compilation is offered as a "finding list" for rapid and convenient use.

 2. The tune names, page references (t=top, b=bottom), first lines (whatever will fit), keys and time signatures are as given in *The Sacred Harp 1991 Edition*.

 3. Tempo indications, such as Mod, Mod+/-, Slow, Fast, Slow/Fast, etc. are the compiler's personal impressions of how we sing these tunes and are not intended to be definitive (and could be wrong!).

 4. Information is given under Style as to the number of verses printed in SH'91, whether repeats are indicated, fuging tunes, etc. In any event it is up to the caller, leader or singers to decide which verses---with or without repeats---will be sung.

 5. Tune source and date, and author/date are as given in SH'91.

 6. Parting Friends (SH'91, #267) is traditionally sung by AASHS as the final tune at any singing.
